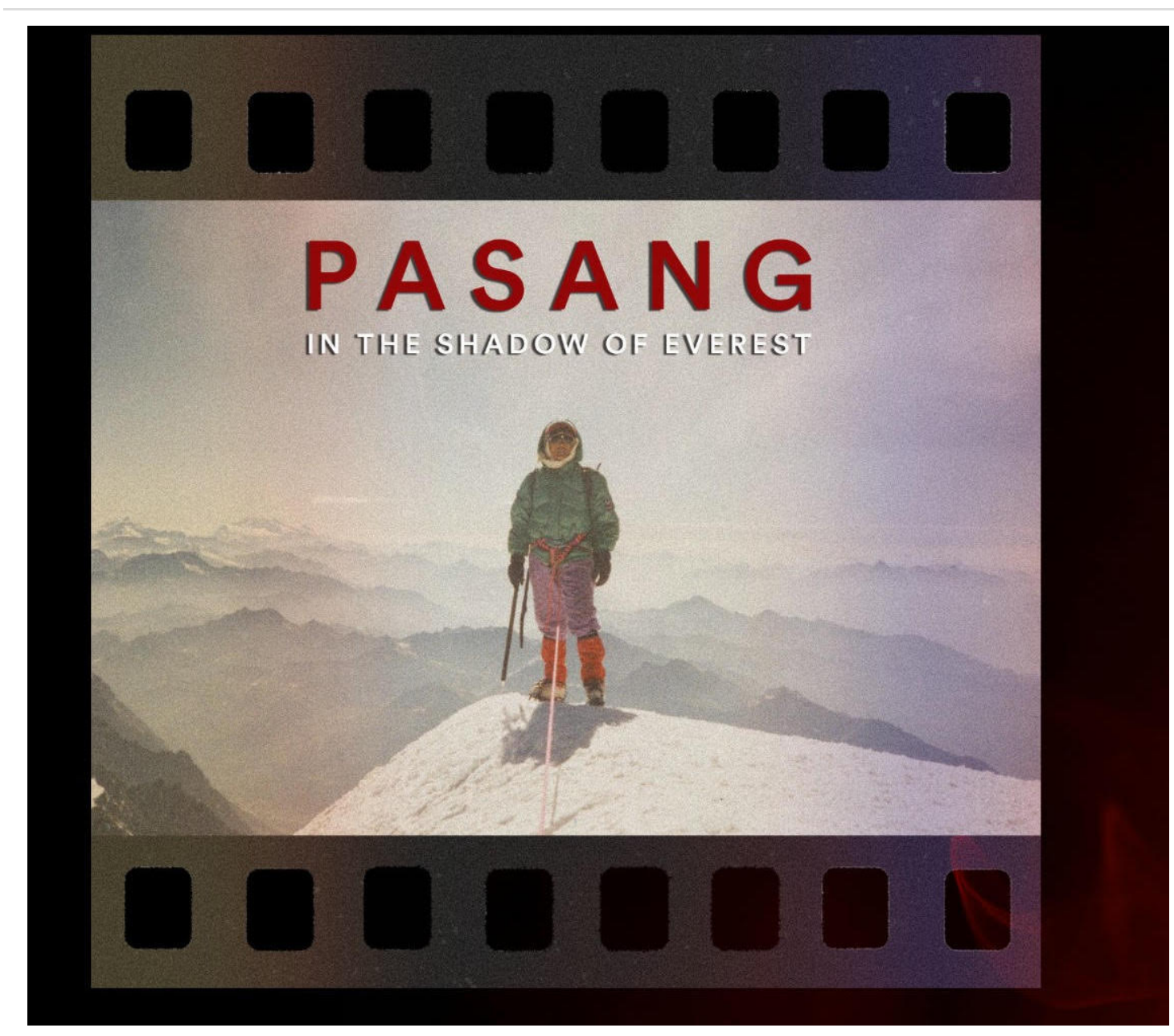


A historical documentary about the life of Pasang Lhamu Sherpa will be shown in New York starting today

Pasang in the Shadow of Everest, about the remarkable



life journey of Pasang Lhamu Sherpa, will be shown in New York from today. Pasang Lhamu Sherpa made history on April 22, 1993 by becoming the first Nepali woman to climb Mount Everest.



The documentary will be screened at Cinema Village in New York City's Greenwich Village from January 19th to 25th, and then at the New Plaza Cinema on the Upper West Side from January 27th to 28th.

From breaking social norms in a conservative Nepali family to running away and getting married at the age of 17, facing family disapproval for marriage, learning English and actively participating in her husband's business, the documentary covers topics such as.

Pasang's steadfast determination and resilience are shown through the film. Especially in her attempts to climb Mt. Everest, despite facing repeated failures, she remained steadfast and decided to make a fourth attempt in 1993 by leading the Nepal-India joint expedition.



Pasang's life is a poignant example of resilience, determination and breaking gender barriers. She has become a symbol of Nepali women's ability and strength. She has also become a symbol of courage.

Pasang Lhamu Sherpa climbed from the south face of Mt. She died while returning from the summit of Mount Everest with her husband Sonam Chiring. Before climbing Everest, she had climbed Mont Blanc, Cho Yu and other mountains.

Honoring the Sahas of Pasang Lhamu, the Government of Nepal has declared him the National Bibhuti of Nepal. The government declared Sherpa as a national monument on 10th Baisakh, 2059.

She became the 17th woman in the world and the first woman from Nepal to climb Everest on the flag vehicle of Nepal. Pasang died while returning after the climb. After his death, Pasang was awarded the prestigious Nepal Star.
